The Days of Modern Man



'Moral' Days - Little Restraint

Many years ago, when the earth was young, there lived a man named Noah. The people of his day were morally alright by our standards. "They ate, they drank, they married wives, they were given in marriage, until the day that Noah entered into the ark; and the flood came and destroyed them all" (Luke 17:27).

Some may even say that the problem was not their moral behaviour. Their problem was the rejection of God and His word. Although they might have been morally 'good' (as men see goodness), God knew and could see that their hearts were not pure in His sight. In fact, they proved this by rejecting God and the word of God spoken by His servant Noah. God is warning you today. His judgement is coming. He will judge sin (all unrighteousness is sin).

Modern days – Reckless Abandon

The Bible declares that God turned "the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah into ashes, He condemned them with an overthrow, setting an example to men intending to live ungodly" (2 Peter 2:6).

The men in Noah's day did not escape although every provision had been made for their salvation. The men of Lot's day did not escape although every warning had been given. "How shall we escape if we neglect so great salvation?" (Hebrews 2:3a).

You need to escape for your life, but how? God has provided the only escape route and it is clearly shown to us in the Word of God, the Bible. The Lord Jesus Christ says: "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life; no one comes to the Father but by Me" (John 14:6). Peter in Acts 4:10 sets forward the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth and says: "And there is salvation in no other One; for there is no other name under Heaven given among men by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12).
