#### PROMISE OF THE SAVIOUR

We desire to examine and enjoy some scriptures as they relate to a very relevant truth at this time. We immediately state that the **word of God** is our only authority and the **Holy Spirit** our only Guide, Jude 3, Jn 16:26. We also assert at once, that the word of God clearly shows that the church will **not** go through **the great tribulation**. It will instead experience a **glo-rious translation** to heaven, at the coming of Christ for it.

We further state that the next event expected, is the coming of Christ for His church at any moment. This event rests solely in the hands of God the Father, and is independent of any signs. There is no need for date setting, clock watching or sign seeking, but simply the waiting for the Lord from heaven.

In the book of Revelation, God has promised a **special blessing** to all who desire and care enough to examine and keep the prophetic teachings of scripture. There is no word like the Lord's, and no blessing and happiness like what He gives. May this **happiness** be ours now as we pursue this study.

"Blessed *is* he that readeth, and they that hear the words of this prophecy, and keep those things which are written therein: for the time *is* at hand." Rev 1:3.

Paul, Peter, John and other apostles were led by God the Holy Spirit to write letters to several churches and individuals. The principles, promises and practices in these letters were not meant solely for those churches or individuals at the time of the writing.

The messages they contain are for all believers who form the church throughout its entire existence on earth.

"Unto the church of God which is at Corinth, to them that are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called *to be* saints, **with all that in every place** call upon the name of Jesus Christ our Lord, both theirs and ours:" 1 Cor 1:2.

We must also see the seven letters to seven local churches in Revelation ch 2 and 3, as a message to the church for all time. To deny this would (a) suggest that the Lord had only those 7 local churches and only 7 'angels' in His hands and (b) ignore the fact that the message to these is expressly said to be for all the church in its entire existence: "... he that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith to the churches." seven times. The number 7 is often used representatively in the book of Revelation, and indicates completeness, totality and often perfection. Thus the church is addressed in its completeness, either at any one time or throughout its existence.

The seven churches (local) are thus **also** associated with seven **characteristic** periods of the church's (corporate) history. The church in Philadelphia, one of the last, was weak, yet special commendation was given to it, because of simply keeping the Lord's word and not denying His name. Let us examine His **promise** to them and us, the churches, in Rev 3:10.

"... for thou hast a little strength, and hast kept my word, and hast not denied my name... Because thou hast kept the word of my patience, I also will keep thee from the hour of temptation [trial], which shall come upon all the world, to try them that dwell upon the earth [earth dwellers]." Rev 3:8, 10.

**"Kept the word of my patience."** The weakest believer simply **holding on** to the word of God with special emphasis on patience as to **Christ's coming,** can claim this precious promise. Let us hold on to this word as we study it.

"Hour of trial." This singles out a <u>specific period which</u> is clearly identifiable. It is a special time that is coming, and spoken of in the prophetic word. It cannot be the same as that expressed in "These things I have spoken unto you, that in me ye might have peace. In the world ye [all believers] shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world." John 16:33. The hour of trial is a **distinct** period in the world's history and not all the time of the believer's life. This hour is the last week of seven (7) years of Daniel 9, called the tribula-

tion. The first  $3\frac{1}{2}$  years is the beginning of sorrows, and the last  $3\frac{1}{2}$  years is the great tribulation. Mat 24:8, 21.

"Which shall come." It is a future hour of suffering.

The hour of trial is spoken of as future relative to this message to Philadelphia, a message that is ever relevant to present church experiences. "He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches." Rev 3:13. There was and always will be suffering in the church but this is not the suffering of the great tribulation. The Lord Jesus had already addressed the church of Smyrna which was suffering and would have continued to suffer severely.

"I know thy works, and **tribulation**, and poverty, ... Fear none of those things which thou shalt suffer: .... and **ye shall have tribulation** ten days: be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life." Rev 2:9, 10.

Nevertheless, the **hour of trial** had not yet come and was still future. All of the apostles wrote of **present** trial in which all

believers share, but they never equated it with the great tribulation. (See 1 Pet 1, James 1, Rom. 5 and 1 Thes). In Revelation 1:9, John was also passing through tribulation which was quite different from what he later described in chapters 6-19.

<u>habitant</u> of the earth, not one earth dweller, will escape this hour of trial. All persons living on earth will be affected. It is not a selective christian experience as suffering for Christ.

"I also will keep thee from." The promise of the Saviour is not simply to be kept "from" but literally to be kept "out of" the future hour of trial that is going to come upon all the inhabitants of the earth. They will not be kept in or through it, but from it altogether. If the hour of trial comes on those who dwell on earth, then in order to be kept out of it, the church must no longer be existing on earth at the time of the tribulation. In some way the church must be removed before it comes.

The promise of being kept from the tribulation period is followed by the **means** of being kept from it, in the next verse.

"Behold, I come quickly: hold that fast which thou hast, that no man take thy crown. "Him that overcometh will I make a pillar in the temple of my God, and he shall go no more out: and I will write upon him the name of my God, and the name of the city of my God, which is new Jerusalem, which cometh down out of heaven from my God: and I will write upon him my new name." Rev 3:11 - 12.

He comes quickly and translates them from earth to heaven. They are thus encouraged to hold these **truths** fast so that no one rob them of rewards to be given to them when He comes. There, they are made pillars of the heavenly and divine temple and form part of the heavenly city which is seen later coming out of heaven and from God, Rev 21:10. To come out from heaven, we must first have gone in. Let us remember that this word of comfort to the seven local churches is a word not only for those at the time of John's writing, but is a present word for us, along with all the other new testament writings to the church.

Dear reader, we trust that you are truly born again into the one true church. If not, when Christ comes for the church, you will be left behind to face, not only an eternity of judgement, but also the great tribulation on earth. You can become a child of God by calling on the Lord Jesus in repentance and faith.

"Seek ye the LORD while he may be found, call ye upon him while he is near: Let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts: and let him return unto the LORD, and he will have mercy upon him; and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon." Isa 55:6-7.

Let us, who are born again, take with gratitude, the Lord Jesus' promise to His **waiting** church. We, the church, are never seen as earth dwellers, but **pilgrims**, (see ch 10). As such, we will never pass through the tribulation period, but will be kept altogether from it. **This is the promise of the Saviour.**
