
The Cat and the Mongoose



"...the Son of God, who loved me, and GAVE HIMSELF for me" (Gal 2:20).

Thankfully they only love chicks and eggs.

Chicks are only safe near to the hens. They fight for the chicks by attacking and pecking their enemies fiercely with their beaks. When danger is near the hen makes a clucking call and the chicks go to her. They dare not disobey.

One day we were in the yard, with the chickens all around. The cat was there in a playful mood. Suddenly, we saw a full grown mongoose creeping towards the chicks. The animals spotted it and the hen quickly called her chicks. Everyone became quiet and no one moved.

All at once we saw the cat crouch. We had never seen or heard of a cat attacking a mongoose. We watched him not knowing what he was thinking. In a flash, the cat darted with amazing speed, gripped the mongoose, and broke its neck, as only cats can. The mongoose died

instantly. All of this happened in a split second. The fearful foe was destroyed. To this day it is one of the most amazing feats that I have ever seen.

The cat now became our very brave and unforgettable pet. We all went across and stroked it and petted it. He had done a great job. As we felt his fur, we noticed that his body was hot like fire.
